3. SPEECH OF EFA PRESIDENT

Talking points: EFA impact today

Next steps: Hybrid meeting before Christmas 2024. Council members are asked to convey

interesting ideas, news or proposals to help further the work of EFA.

4. INPUTS

Talking points: Ideas and suggestions by SAC members:

- Further expand the scholarship programme and increase diversity;
- Increase overall diversity in the programme and among participants;
- Give space to the 'inner dimension' of the necessary social change;
- Utilise and further expand 'Alpbach in motion';
- Consider an EFA 'Ambassador Programme';
- Internationalisation of the participants: Make Alpbach better known in other countries;
- Take alternative offers for interested participants/competition seriously and emphasise Alpbach's added value more clearly;
- Since the absolute change in the world is not sufficiently reflected in the 'European consciousness', Alpbach should address the divergence between the European internal view and the assessments of the 'others' more strongly and intensify the discussion;
- Problematise the concept of democracy and state more clearly what we want to achieve in Alpbach;
- Communicate the results of the EFA more widely;
- Continue/improve work on interfaces with the village, local businesses, the province of Tyrol and the Euregio;
- Examine possible solutions from the village perspective;
- We need a positive narrative for the future;
- Alpbach should try to overcome the compartmentalisation of individual areas of society;
- What can Alpbach contribute to strengthening social resilience and liberal democracy (justice - science - civil society)?
- Emphasise the importance of journalism;
- There is a lack of 35- to 45-year-olds in Alpbach; how can we address them?
- How can technology be utilised for democracy?
- The protected environment of the 'labs' should be utilised for more willingness to take risks in the search for solutions;
- Preserve and promote the scientific nature of the forum;



- Can we offer retreats for the EU Commission or individual directorates?
 (Note Irene GR: during time as Ambassador to the UN in Vienna and also afterwards, such UN retreats organised by the UN itself took place several times; the participants in the UN retreats were then of course also able to interact with the general programme;
- Aim for links/synergies with Salzburg Global Seminar;
- Do not forget K. Popper's legacy meta-themes defence of democracy;
- Make 'unusual' offers: e.g. 'String Instrument Exchange';
- Aim for more substance more depth;
- Scaling peace creating identity both internally and externally;
- Invite the left and right fringes of social discourse (examples mentioned: Sarah Wagenknecht and V. Orban)
- Collaboration between AVL Cultural Foundation and Thun-Hohenstein announced;
- Do not neglect technology and research and look for ways to bring them back to Alpbach (after AIT held its own technology symposium in September 2024)
- Twinnings of the UBA in the Western Balkans were mentioned as a successful model that has led to high-level networking in the Balkans;
- Work on the interface: climate & security & digitalisation;
- What does the EFA business plan look like?
- Which brackets hold our society together? What can EFA do to strengthen these brackets?
